

2,943 in person and virtual Early Intervention visits were provided to children and families in Auglaize County in 2020.





» In March of 2020, the Early Intervention team was faced with the challenge of serving children and families without being able to meet with them in their homes as we normally would. While the EI team missed seeing parents and children face-toface, we were able to transition into using an online platform to provide coaching services virtually. It was a wonderful team effort in working with so many wonderful parents to make our online visits a success.







» As the EI team worked together to think of creative ways to reach families during 2020, activity bags were prepared and delivered to the children in Early Intervention in December. Each child received a book along with jingle bells and an activity sheet with many wonderful ideas on how to use the bells during play.
