It's impossible to understand how far you've come without occasionally looking back. 2023 provided many opportunities for looking back as we celebrated 70 years of support.

With great reverence, we looked back on the 3 mothers, Pauline Gilberg, Leona Gruebmeyer, and Arlene Caywood, who took the first steps in 1953 toward ensuring their children with developmental disabilities would have a school to attend. With gratitude, we revisited the history captured by Arlene Caywood who served as secretary of the Auglaize School Board. With wonderment and pride, we reflected on the impact of advocacy and changing attitudes about people with disabilities over the years.

Recognizing the significant and historical strides we've made is what keeps us moving forward with intent. The program that started with 21 children now serves over 255 children and over 150 adults. Those services, however, no longer happen inside

one building; they happen throughout the county where people live, learn, work, and play. We believe that with increased understanding and acceptance comes increased inclusion and accessibility. In addition to celebrating the old, 2023 was a year for the introduction of many firsts including: the Sensory Shed at the Auglaize County Fair, 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Essay Contest, Auglaize DD Legacy Scholarship for area students interested in a career in the DD field, and the campaign for the installation of universal changing tables throughout the county for greater accessibility for all.



We thank you for your support over the last 70 years and look forward to seeing you out and about in 2024!




## **2023 Provider Summary**
