

Children are assessed through play in the following areas:

Gross Motor: How they roll, crawl, sit, walk.

Fine Motor: How they use their hands and play with toys.

Speech: How people understand what they say.

Language: How they understand you and how they communicate (gestures, words).

Cognition: How they learn, reason and understand the world around them.

Adaptive Behavior: How they perform daily routines such as eating, dressing and using the restroom.

Social-Emotional Development: How they get along with others, react to new situations and express emotion.

Sensory Development: How they perceive the world around them in the sensory areas of sight, touch, taste, smell, movement and hearing.

Feeding: How well they nurse or take the bottle and accept and tolerate new food and textures.

Year-Round Services

- Early Intervention Services are provided year-round and are available at no cost to families in Auglaize County.
- We work in partnership with area school districts to help children transition to public or private preschool services when a child turns three.



Service Coordination for All Families

- A Service Coordinator is assigned immediately upon referral to the Early Intervention program.
- The Service Coordinator assists families through the evaluation and assessment process and links them to resources.

Parents are the Expert When it Comes to Their Child

- We believe parents and caregivers are a child's best teacher and are the most important part of the team supporting their child.
- The Early Intervention Team will meet several times per year to review the goals for each family and child. Parents and family members are a part of this Early Intervention Team and are invited to participate in these meetings by phone, online or in-person.

Team of Professionals

- Our Early Intervention program is made up of a core team of professionals that support the family, promoting early childhood learning and development.
- Our core team of professionals include:
 - ☆ Developmental Specialists
 - ☆ Occupational Therapists
 - ☆ Physical Therapists
 - ☆ Speech-Language Pathologists
- Depending on the need of the family, additional professionals may include: Early Childhood Mental Health Consultants, Hearing Specialists, Vision Specialists and more.



Children Learn Best in their Natural Environment

- Children learn everyday through each interaction with those around them.
- Our Early Intervention staff provide family focused supports based upon priorities identified by parents and caregivers.
- We work with families to promote their child's development and learning by focusing on the families' strengths and by creating fun learning opportunities through play and other daily activities.
